Dear All

How can people do this? The waste, the carnage, the misery, the grief, the tears – these are all our thoughts, I'm sure, over the devastation caused by a young man, brought up in this country, who enjoyed what was available to him. He turned his back on this life style, ended his life, the lives of 22 people and maiming many others at a pop concert in Manchester. Under 2 weeks three terrorists murdered 8 and injured many in London. The victims were enjoying a night out eating and drinking with friends.

I don't have the answers for such horrific attacks. However there have been acts of gallantry by those who sacrificed their own safety to care for others. Then there are the offers of help – taxi drivers in Manchester ferrying the maimed and families at no cost. Others were offering refreshments.

Did you hear about Chris Parker, a homeless man in Manchester who offered help to those in need? He had not seen his mother, who lives in Norwich, in 5 years, she contacted him and they have been reunited. Out of tragedy can come some good. However those who have lost loved ones or had relatives seriously injured, may not be in a position to agree.

I heard of another good will story. A young mum took her two young children to buy some clothes on the hottest day of the year. She got to the checkout; her debit card was at home! She burst into tears, but found some cash, not enough – more tears. She walked out. There was a shout from a member of the public, calling her back. Her friend offered to pay the additional monies – more tears (of joy). This stranger did not want any money, but a donation to charity. All went away happy. Acts of kindness are taking place day by day, but we don't always hear about them.

Sadly we are living in a period when there may be other attacks. Thus we have to be vigilant, not fearful, and go about our lives believing that the goodness we see in most humans surpasses the evil we have witnessed too much recently.

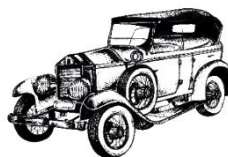
