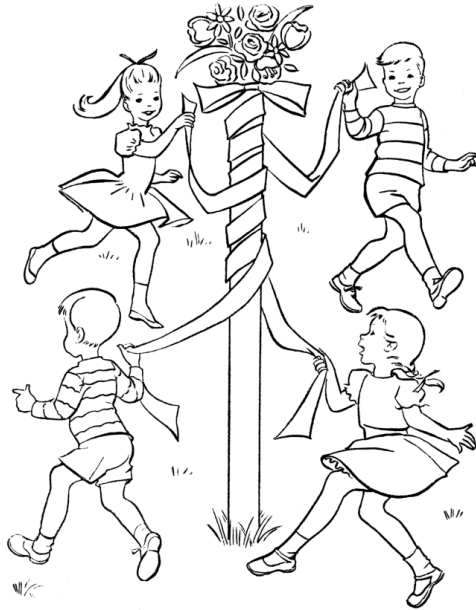

WAVENEY FOOD BANK (excerpt from Beccles & Bungay Journal 07/04)

Waveney Food Bank has seen the demand for emergency food rise 560% since it opened in 2012. Between April 2015 and April 2016 the centre provided 10,000 meals, 4,200 of which went to children.

From April 2016 onwards the centre provided 19 tonnes of food, which equates to 20,000 meals, of which 40% has gone to families with children or people under 18. On average 60% of the people who use the Foodbank are aged between 20 and 60 years of age. Each year the figures of people using the Foodbank have doubled.

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK: STANDING WITH REFUGEES LIKE NEJEBAR

Nejebbar and her family have fled horrors in Afghanistan, where her husband was threatened with torture and death for being a government worker. But now they've arrived in Greece, all they have is a tent. They have no other protection against wind and rain.



There's no school for their five children. And they have no certainty or clear idea of what will happen to them now. They thought they would stay here for 10 days, but it's already been six months and there's no end in sight.

Nejebar's husband Noor describes their initial reaction to arriving in the camp in Greece: 'It was like suicide for us. But we took the decision that it is better to die here than to die there from war.'

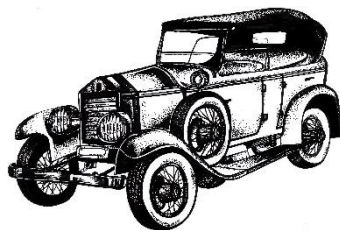
