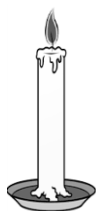

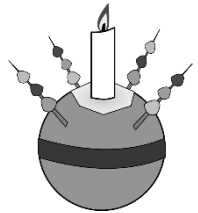

REMEMBRANCE IN HARDWICK AND SHELTON

Over 40 people from the parish and elsewhere gathered for the Remembrance Day service at Hardwick Church this year, including descendants of several of the 17 men honoured on the war memorial plaque. Everyone was invited to present poppy-decorated crosses in memory of relatives and others who had died in conflict - whether in the First World War or in later service - and in addition to those for local men more than 20 other crosses were placed in commemoration of individuals or their units from across the UK. Some members of the congregation had also brought family memorabilia to share and the resulting display of medals, pictures and service documents - relating to 10 men from various parts of the country - provided a focus of much interest and discussion during refreshments after the service. So, too, did the stunning tapestry, prepared by Shelton with Hardwick Community School and kindly loaned to the Church, which made a striking altar frontal. WOODTON COMMUNITY WOOD BEHIND SUCKLING PLACE. For the past year, Woodton Parish Council has managed the wood owned by South Norfolk Council. We are currently in the final legal process of having this wood

‘divested’ with Full Title to Woodton Parish Council from South Norfolk Council. During this last year, excess and diseased trees have been removed, tops chipped and undergrowth cleared. This has been achieved with great help from the Community Payback Scheme. The next stage is to put down hard surface pathways through the wood to enable all, including the young, old, physically challenged and wheelchair users to be able to enjoy these amenities. Grants totalling £8,500 have already been secured from the Awards for All – Big Lottery Fund and Tesco Bags of Help Scheme. Further grants are being sought. Initially, this project started with the help of local parishioners. Thanks are also due to Helen Sibley (SNC), Carl Wade, the Community Service and many others who offered help.

Any parishioners who would like to assist in the upkeep of this project should contact any Woodton Parish Councillor. The Parish Council looks forward to continuing this project further in conjunction with the community.
