Charities here to help you...

The Bedingham Charity

It may come as a surprise to some of you that we have our very own historical charity still running within our small Village,

Having lived in the village for 28 years I hadn't a clue that it existed. To have something so historical go unnoticed felt somewhat sad.

The charity started in 1834 following a bequest in the Will of Mary Button and was known then as the **Button Charity**. Mary left monies to the village of Bedingham to support those in need. Items such as furniture, bedding, clothing, fuel, food, tools and books were gifted; the list was endless. Each year monies were allocated and documented and over the years the charity has been added to by other bequests from local residents.

I'm sure that several of you may be related to some of those documented; the surnames of Gooch, Purser and Stone are just a few recognizable as still being local to our area

Having recently taken over as chairman, myself and the other trustees felt that we would like to share more of the history and events of this charity with our the villagers of Bedingham.

We are currently starting to document some notable events and names within the records we have.

We are considering arranging a type of gathering to share the current information with villagers once we have collated everything together but we would welcome any further information regarding relatives etc. who may have benefitted or added to the charity in the past.

Topcroft Poorlands Charity

This is a small charity set up in 1600's. In 1811, "Norfolk Charities" recorded that about 2 acres of land were rendered at a Court baron by Robert Goodwyn, to feoffes for the benefit of those in need in the village. This land continues to provide income for the charity. Originally help was given in the form of food, blankets and coal. Over recent years it is given as a monetary donation.

Topcroft Church Room Charity

Morningthorpe Non-Ecclesiastical Charity

Although named after Morningthorpe, this charity covers both the parishes of Fritton and Morningthorpe.

Administration of the charity is in the hand of two trustees and the team vicar and the current members are: Stanley Youngman (representing Morningthorpe) 01508 498115, Carol McDonnell (representing Fritton) 01508 531629 and the Revd. Liz Billett.

As recorded in the governing document dated 31st January 1928, the object of the charity is “the assistance of poor and public purpose for the benefit of the parish”. Funding is generated through leasing of land owned by the charity together with income from investments. At the discretion of the trustees, a number of allowances can be made towards assisting with needs such as serious medical conditions, funeral expenses (paid to the surviving spouse) or fuel allowances for single pensioners.

If any parishioner in either parish wishes to apply for an allowance please contact one the trustees.

Hempnall Trust—Financial help for those in need

The Hempnall Trust is a long established village charity which exists to support those in the parish of Hempnall who are experiencing 'need, hardship or distress'. It provides grants to anyone who has been resident in the parish for more than a year to assist with a wide range of needs (e.g. financial, emotional, social, health and/or mobility related). Grants are awarded confidentially and there is no means testing.

Foodbank (Hempnall Group) Aug 2021

I was born during the war when all food was rationed. I don't remember being hungry but there weren't many treats though my mum made a really nice chocolate cake for my birthday with no eggs. I remember the excitement when sweets were no longer rationed. We did go without certain things, but what was good about it, was that nothing was wasted.

As the years have gone by, I have watched perfectly good leftovers tipped in the bin. I read in the papers how much food people waste every year and how much supermarkets throw away. When Brian and I were in Cambodia, we had supper with some street children. I was given more than I could eat but I didn't need to worry my plate was eagerly seized and the food eaten by the child next to me.

We are use to hearing about hungry people in Cambodia, Africa etc, but here in England? That seems so wrong!

Consequently, we are really pleased to be able to help with the food bank. Food is collected every first Sunday of the month at church or at the church office on the Monday after or you could bring it to Clay Cottage. We are always amazed at the generosity of everyone, and the hard work of the volunteers at the depot. We try to help by sorting into similar types of food and every box and bag is labelled so they know where it comes from. So thank you all who give so generously and thank you John and Penny who ran it for such a long time.

TWAM (tools with a mission)

Does your shed need a good clear out? Do you find it hard to throw things away?

If so TWAM might be your answer. TWAM collects tools, sewing machines and sewing materials and computers. Volunteers sort and repair the tools and make them into trade kits.

These trade kits might be for Carpentry, Building, Motor Mechanics, Electrical, Plumbing, Agriculture, Ground Workers or Sewing for example. Anything can be donated from Sewing and Knitting machines to Computers and Laptops.

On average two containers a month are shipped to Africa packed with tools destined for up to 40 applicants. Just imagine all those people given the opportunity to earn a living, to feed and house their families.

Our nearest refurbishment depot is in Ipswich, but help is much closer to home. Brian Cutting is the local collector. A quick call to the Cuttings on 01508 499600 and the collection of your unwanted items can easily be arranged.

Many of the homes we visit have lost a loved one and amidst the sadness is this small joy that the tools that their father, mother or husband had valued are going to be used to change a life.

As one lady handed over her mother's sewing machine, she said "My mum would be so pleased that in Africa someone will value it and use it to make a new life."

So, if you think you have things that you no longer use but someone else would love to give us a ring. Thank you.

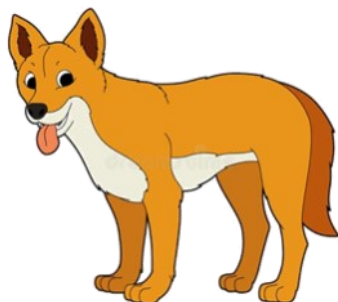
We will be collecting shoe boxes again this year, boxes are available from the church office.

September in the Garden...

As late summer moves towards the Autumn, September is generally a cooler, windier month than August and the days are noticeably shorter.

If you have a fruit or vegetable patch, you'll be busy reaping the rewards of harvest. It's also time to get out and start planting spring-flowering bulbs for next year and you can collect seeds for next summer's colour too. Make the most of the remaining warmth while you can!



TOP TEN TO DO LIST

1. Divide herbaceous perennials
2. Pick autumn raspberries
3. Dig up remaining potatoes before slug damage spoils them
4. Collect and sow seeds from hardy annuals and perennials
5. Keep up with watering of new plants, using rain or grey water if possible
6. Start to reduce the frequency of houseplant watering
7. Clean out cold frames and greenhouses so that they are ready for use in the autumn
8. Cover leafy vegetable crops with bird-proof netting
9. Plant spring flowering bulbs
10. Cover ponds before autumn leaf fall
