Volunteer to plant trees with us

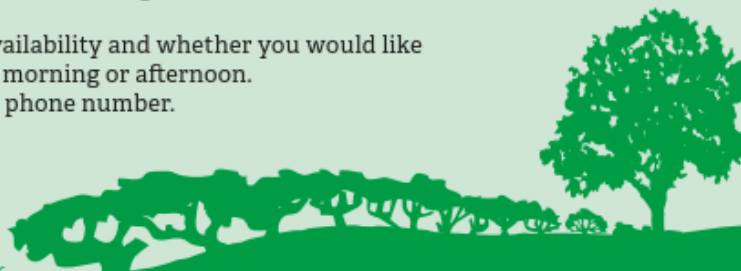

Opportunities for Natural Flood Management (NFM) above Hempnall

The Environment Agency, Norfolk County Council and Hempnall Parish Council are currently exploring opportunities to help ‘slow the flow’ above Hempnall village. Slowing the downstream transportation of water during peak rainfall events can help reduce flooding to people and properties. Measures that can help ‘slow the flow’ include simple actions such as tree planting on hillslopes and along watercourses to help intercept overland runoff. Other measures include allowing water to be stored temporarily in low spots where the ground often sits wet and adding leaky dams to watercourses and ditches to physically hold water up behind them. Slowing these flow pathways to benefit communities at risk of flooding downstream is called Natural Flood Management. Flooding Advice

HAVE YOU BEEN AFFECTED BY FLOODING?

There are many reasons why flooding occurs. If you know of any blocked ditches, culverts or other flood related problems, please send details including the area/s affected, to the Clerk to the Parish Council, to assist your Parish Council in compiling data of problem areas. Please reply to topcroftpc@gmail.com – your information will be treated confidentially.

On this leaflet we have put together a list of agencies you can contact if we have extreme rainfall again. The list is by no means exhaustive but we feel there is enough information for you to put into your address books or mobile phones.

You can also sign up with the **Environment Agency** for useful advice and alerts and they list all the advice you need to help make your home safe from flooding.

Organisations responsible for flood warnings and who are able to provide assistance in areas affected by floodwater:

Environment Agency

- Issues flood warnings for flooding from rivers, the sea and groundwater
- Receives and records details of flooding incidents.
- Monitors the situation and advises other organisations.
- Deals with emergency repairs and blockages on main rivers and own structures.
- Responds to pollution incidents.

Norfolk County Council

- Co-ordinate's emergency arrangements.
- Maintains safe conditions on the roads.
- Puts floodwater signs on the highway.
- Organises road closure and traffic closures.
- Clears blockages on highway drainage systems.
- May take action to protect property from flooding by water from the highway where there is a failure of the highway drainage system.

2022 races ahead and as we head into March, I draw my breath remembering March 2020 when the covid -19 pandemic was declared by the WHO. The practice has faced immense challenges in the past 2 years and we have reflected and realised that there have been many positives which we hope to take forward. The practice needs your support as it expands its services to accommodate the increasing practice population that is expected with new housing. The question arises – how can our patients offer support and improve our service? One of the most effective methods is by joining our Patient Participation Group (PPG). Many of you are already aware of our PPG. We do need more members to ensure we have adequate representation of our practice population. Currently there are 11 members in our PPG. Our PPG would benefit from anyone aged 17 – 50 to make the group more representative of our practice population. The only membership requirement is that you are a registered patient at our practice.

What is a PPG?

A Patient Participation Group (PPG) is a group of patients, carers and GP practice staff who meet to discuss practice issues and patient experience to improve the service.

Purpose of a PPG:

- To give patients and practice staff the opportunity to meet and discuss topics of mutual interest.
- To provide a means for patients to become more involved and make suggestions about the healthcare services they receive.
- To explore issues from patient complaints and patient surveys, contribute to actions plans and help monitor improvements.
- To contribute feedback to the practice on National Patient Survey results and Friends and Family Test feedback to propose developments or change.
- To support health awareness and patient education

The Garden in March....

Spring usually arrives by mid-March and the frequent sunny days provide the opportunity for an increasing range of gardening tasks. It's time to get busy preparing seed beds, sowing seed, cutting back winter shrubs and generally tidying up around the garden.



1. **Prune bush and climbing roses.**

2. **Plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes.**



Onions are such a useful vegetable – they feature in so many recipes, and growing your own means you'll always have them to hand.



3. **Plant summer-flowering bulbs.**

Bulbs make a fine display planted in containers or borders, especially daffodils, snowdrops and tulips in spring. They are one of the easiest and most rewarding garden plants to grow.

4. **Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials.**

5. **Top dress containers with fresh compost.**

6. **Mow the lawn on dry days (if needed).**



7. **Cut back Cornus (dogwood) and Salix (willow) grown for colourful winter stems**

8. **Hoe and mulch weeds to keep them under control early.**

9. **Start feeding fish and using the pond fountain; remove pond heaters.**

10. **Protect new spring shoots from slugs.**

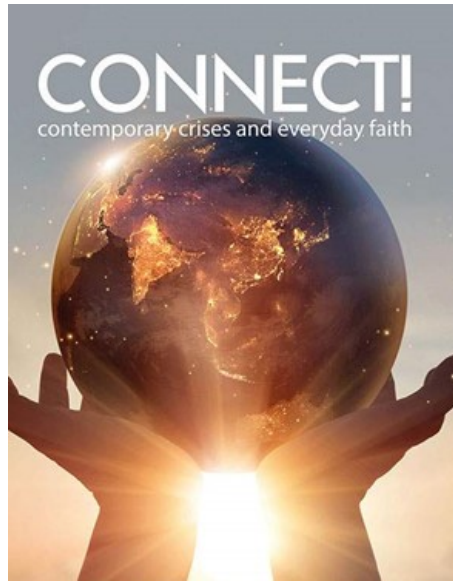
