Reduction in Hempnall Parish Council Tax

Parish councillors have voted to keep the precept raised via your council tax the same as the previous 3 years. Because the number of properties in Hempnall has increased, this will again mean a reduction on the amount paid by each household.



Parish Meeting re East Pye Solar

Parishioners received an invitation to a parish meeting held on 8 November which was attended by around 300 people, the majority from Hempnall. The meeting was called to allow people the chance to learn more about the project, ask questions and give their views both for and against. A show of hands was taken at the end to indicate who was in favour of the East Pye Solar development and who was against it. Only one person voted to support the proposals, less than 10 people abstained and everyone else present voted to oppose the scheme. In addition, we

received communications from people unable to attend the meeting who wished it to be known they were against the proposed scheme.

I was reminded by our ever-capable Administrator Dawn that it was that time of the month to write an article for the parish magazines. She also suggested a relevant topic for the month of February – healthy eating. This is such a relevant topic at any point in time. We hear so much about obesity and the related co-morbidities, childhood obesity and the impact for the future, the implications for the NHS and the economic implications.

We hear and read about healthy eating and once every so often, a refresher is important. This may help us reflect on our eating habits and make necessary changes with the aim of prevention of several illnesses and improving our physical and mental health.

Health professionals employ the phrase ‘healthy eating’ frequently. Healthy eating involves eating a balanced diet. Our current healthy eating model in the UK is called the Eatwell guide. There is a scientific basis to this guide, and it looks at the balance of food and drinks needed in our diet. It recommends the amounts of nutrients needed for a healthy state of the body.

I want to add a paragraph about the 5 a day concept. It encourages us to add different types and colours of fruit and vegetables to our diet. This also has a scientific basis. The NHS website gives us 5 reasons to include 5 a day in our diet:

1. Fruit and vegetables are a good source of vitamins and minerals, including folate, vitamin C, vitamin A and potassium.
2. They're an excellent source of dietary fibre, which can help to maintain a healthy gut and prevent constipation and other digestion problems. A diet high in fibre can also reduce your risk of bowel cancer.
3. They can help to reduce your risk of heart disease, stroke and some types of cancer
4. Fruit and vegetables contribute to a healthy, balanced diet.
5. Fruit and vegetables taste delicious and there's so much variety to choose from.

One does not have to wait for another New Year to make a resolution. Let this February 2025 resolution be about looking after ourselves. The community benefits, the country benefits, the world benefits from individuals who can make the change.

Gardening in February.....

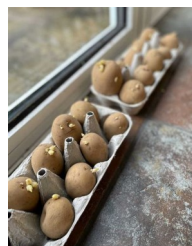
Spring is in sight

This month there are signs of the approaching spring, with bulbs appearing and wildlife waking up as day length and temperatures increase. There's plenty to do indoors this month to prepare for the season ahead. Outdoors, as the garden comes to life again, it's time to prune certain shrubs and climbers, such as Wisteria.



1. **Prepare vegetable seed beds, and sow some vegetables under cover.** Knowing which vegetables to sow where, when and how means you can maintain constant supplies throughout the season.

2. **Chit potato tubers.** It's important with earlies, and a good idea with maincrops, to 'chit' the seed potatoes before planting. This means allowing them to start sprouting shoots.



3. **Protect blossom on apricots, nectarines and peaches.** Most top fruit and soft fruit are very hardy but once they start into growth in spring, flowers and buds are especially vulnerable to frost and may need protection to crop well.

Bridges

As we move from 2024 to 2025 into an unknown new year there is a feeling of excitement or concern about what experiences may lie ahead. We are in effect crossing a bridge.

Having used the Dartford Crossing over the river Thames a couple of times during the Christmas period, I am particularly aware of the impact of bridges as they allow one to cross rivers or gorges seamlessly and can bring together people who otherwise would have little or no contact with each other. This one in particular is used daily by some and frequently by those travelling to Europe by the channel tunnel.

These structures have helped to shape our history, spanning, as they do, rivers which traditionally mark the boundaries of countries, counties or tribes. The Severn Bridge over the Severn estuary is a relatively recent addition which now makes South Wales much more accessible to England. There are the Tyne Bridge and the Forth Bridge important crossings in the

north and then there are bridges which connect islands to the mainland as in Skye. There are also impressive viaducts often carrying trains across valleys and aqueducts for canals, these not only allow direct access but also enable vehicles or boats to maintain a relatively level journey.

Locally we have important river bridges between Norfolk and Suffolk spanning the Waveney, a bridge over the Great Ouse by Kings Lynn and in Norwich a quantity of bridges over the Wensum. In this area of South Norfolk there are many small bridges which will have replaced fords but, in a few places, as there is no bridge we often encounter a ford. This can be negligible in dry periods but an inevitable and often unexpected hazard in rainy weather.

If there is no bridge we might make use of a boat in which case the ferryman (or woman) fulfils a vital function or we might just not go that way in which case the other side of the river becomes foreign territory.

Every time we cross a bridge; we are opening ourselves up to new experiences with the opportunities and challenges these present.

in 2025 we know there will be bridges ahead but we can only guess what they might offer. There will be new experiences, some half anticipated and others quite surprising.

We may find ourselves reunited with old friends or we may make new contacts and build on shared interests. In effect building bridges.

So, may our bridges this year bring us closer to others and provide a meeting point. May we look for opportunities to build a bridge; even if it is only a small plank to begin with it can still provide a crossing place and who knows where it will lead?

May we also cross those bridges that we have been avoiding and take the courage to enjoy whatever lies ahead.
